• Strengthen the marketing of the Watamu area, especially out of season

Consistent and healthy visitor flows are essential in sustaining enterprises and delivering benefits to the community from tourism. There is a particular need to address the severe seasonality of demand and the social problems this brings. The WMA, local businesses, local government and others should work together on website promotion, PR campaigns and other activities. Strong pressure should be placed on KTB to provide more exposure to the area in their marketing.

• Raise the profile of community based experiences and direct business to them

There are now quite a lot of community ecotourism experiences with high expectations. Some are rather similar – e.g. boardwalks and mangrove experiences. Many CBTs have failed in Africa through lack of business. Helping the communities to produce their own leaflets etc. may not bring them sufficient business. There is a need to work closely with the hotels, tour operators and destination promotion sites to raise the profile of these excursions. Developing itineraries that take in the communities would also help.

• Provide a range of training for local stakeholders

Some training has already been provided to different stakeholders but more is needed. Training should be particularly directed to beach operators, boat operators, guides, women's groups and community based tourism enterprises on communication, business, customer care, quality improvement etc. More specific skills training on handicraft production, wildlife interpretation, environmental management, IT and other technical subjects may also be required.

Work with hotels and Ecotourism Kenya to strengthen and award environmental management

The extent to which the hotels in Watamu are engaged in environmental management practices is not fully clear and may require further investigation. Based on this, a coordinated approach to strengthening EMS, with relevant advice and training, could be pursued. The Kenya Eco-Rating scheme could be used as the basis for this, with a target set for a number of new awards in Watamu.

Consider a project to work with hotels/restaurants and local farmers and fishermen to strengthen local supply chains to hotels

The rapid value chain analysis undertaken for the COAST project in Watamu identified supplying produce to hotels and restaurants as a way of reaching poor households, but also pointed out problems with inconsistency of quality and supply. Turtle Bay has been able to source certain produce locally, including fish. A new project would require a number of hotels and restaurants to work together. Supply chain projects do require considerable time and effort so further work may be needed to assess the feasibility of starting a new initiative here. Some lessons are available from other destinations.


General Search Engine Results for "Kenya"

The second link-Malindi & Watamu-Overview does provide more useful information for likely tourists, but still does not provide the real sense of place.











None of the dropdown boxes feature a link to Watamu either. Must click on Tourism and select Destination by Fact and Region.

Clicking on tourism on the top left hand side brings the reader to a general tourism overview that mentions coastal tourism, but not Watamu itself.




Clicking on Parks & Reserves Information on the top left hand side brings up a list of national parks and game reserves, including a link for Watamu.




Clicking on Watamo Marine National Reserve brings up information on the protected area; however it is not detailed enough for tourism purposes.

ABOUT WATAMU

Watamu is a small village located on the Kenyan coast, approximately 120 km north of Mombasa and 25 km south of Malindi. The area has developed an international reputation for its pristine white-sand beaches and reef-protected lagoons, which line the Watamu National Marine Park and Reserves, which are the oldest in East Africa and cover over 229 kmsq. The marine protected areas are also recognized internationally as a UNESCO Biosphere Reserve. This means that the area is designated as a site of natural excellence, and should demonstrate how local people and the environment can co -exist through careful stewardship of our natural marine resources and human assets.

The Marine Park and Reserve is renowned world wide for its natural beauty and boasts a rich marine life from the visiting Whale Sharks and Manta Rays to three species of Sea Turtle. The Park and its coral gardens are one of the main justifications for visiting Watamu. There is an exceptional shoreline with Watamu voted one of the top ten beaches in the world; steeped in natural fauna and flora and with three stunning bays, Watamu, Blue Lagoon and Turtle Bay.

Watamu (means "home of the sweet people" in Swahili) enjoys a friendly community feeling; it is a small although rapidly growing area where most people know and recognize each other. Community development is also coming along apace with a large number of community groups all working together through an umbrella organization called Watamu Marine Association (WMA) to promote the area whilst protecting the environment and working towards sustainable development for the future. WMA is unique organization, probably the first of its kind on the Kenyan Coast. It consists of over 40 member groups and organisations, from the community, tourism and environmental sectors that are committed to resolving many of the multifaceted problems and conflicts that threaten a seemingly trouble-free paradise. We exist to ensure that Watamu in all its pristine beauty can be enjoyed by everyone, including the wildlife.

- On Google.com search there were no comments about safety at the destination, while Italian search revealed 2 "Safety" articles on the first page of Google results with the keywords "Watamu, Kenya". The articles are talking about recent attack on a resort against Italian tourists.
- The destination is perceived by Italian media as a rather risky one in terms of crime

- There is no Italian translation of the main Wikipedia page for Watamu.
- Most of the hotels do have websites both in English and Italian, in few other cases also in Spanish
- Most of the "review videos" on youtube were posted by Italian tourists. Most of them have extremely positive comments about the destination, nature (e.g. beaches and natural life.
 Friendliness of local population was mentioned as well.
- The governmental website has just an English version of the content which is pity http://www.tourism.go.ke/
- While the website for potential tourists has got an Italian version as well:












HOW TO BE A RESPONSIBLE TOURIST

Here are 10 suggestions that will help you to get more out of your holiday, and help to keep your destination special after your departure:

- Read up on Kenya and the coast before you visit. The welcome will be warmer if you take an interest and speak even a few words of Kiswahili.
- 2. When making your booking check if the hotel where you are staying has a written commitment on caring for the environment and local people.
- 3. Dress sensitively. If you wear loose fitting clothes, such as medium length skirts for women and short sleeved shirts you will receive a much better reaction from local people. Also remember that public displays of affection can cause offence.
- 4. Be open-minded. The culture in Kenya is very different from Western countries. People do things here that may seem strange, but make more sense if you understand the local situation. Also remember that timescales are different here. Try to be patient, ask questions and avoid making judgements.
- 5. Buy locally made goods, from the hotel boutique, the beach operators or local sellers. However, DO check that what you are buying is not endangered, such as shells or hardwoods. Ask for carvings made from Neem, Jacaranda, Mango, Coconut or Grevillea.
- Haggle with humour and not aggressively. Ensure that you get good value, but remember that a small amount to you could make a bigger difference to the seller.
- 7. Conserve local resources. Water is scarce here and power is too!
 - Turn the shower off whilst soaping up
 - Re-use your towels if they're not dirty
 - Turn off lighting and air conditioning when not required
- 8. Help preserve local wildlife and habitats by respecting rules and regulations, such as sticking to footpaths, not standing on coral nor removing natural items such as seeds or shells from protected areas. Inform your tour operator if you see any unnecessary disturbance.
- 9. Ask permission before taking photographs of individuals or people's homes. You may be expected to pay for the privilege!

If you wish to give gifts to children, do so in school (to encourage them to go to school) under a teacher's supervision. If you buy items such as pens and exercise books locally (rather than bringing them from home) you spread even more benefits to the local people.

If you want to do more to help the local people or the environment speak to a local person to find out local needs and the best ways of helping. The Community and Conservation office in the hotel are happy to give advice.

This is our flagship programme and involves 3 distinct activities:

Marine turtle nest protection and monitoring programme

Watamu has a small but nationally important nesting population of sea turtles, with an average of 40 nests in year and over in the Watamu/Malindi Marine Parks and Reserves. Watamu Turtle Watch (WTW) has a nest protection program, which works in co-operation with local people & Kenya Wildlife Service to protect all nests laid on Watamu and Malindi beaches. Local participation is encouraged through a financial incentive scheme. Daily patrols check for nesting turtles, and tracks in the sand that indicate new nests. Nesting turtles that are encountered are tagged and biometric data collected.



Schedules are continuously organised to protect and monitor incubating and hatching nests. Nests are allowed to incubate in situ unless they have been laid in

LOT initiated a community development program as an important means to support our conservation and education programs. By holding discussions with local fishing communities we have identified conservation issues and their sources in poverty, population pressure and unsustainable resource use. LOT advises and assists fishermen at landing sites both at sea and in Mida Creek to form community conservation groups. LOT has now established several groups since the year 2000. We now assist and work with 8 community and conservation groups who have shown commitment and dedication. We do however continue to work with other less active groups.



The groups provide a forum for discussing fishing related issues / problems and finding sustainable solutions and alternatives to current destructive natural

Some of the initiatives we support through WMA include:

Sponsoring and partnering the WMA Community Waste Management and Recycling Project which employs 36 local women and youths who not only keep our beach clear of all plastic waste, but also transform washed up flip-flops into colourful and whacky artistic creations. The project received a UNEP SEED Award in 2011 for Supporting Entrepreneurs for Social and Environmental Development.

Independently, we also support:









THE SOUTH: KRIBI'S ATTRACTIVE BEACHES

The centre of tourism in the South Province is Kribi, a seaport and a calm and pleasant resort town with beautiful, pale sand beaches. It is not without reason that the Tourism Delegation for the South Province is in Kribi and not Ebolowa, as is the case for the other provincial government services.

With the construction of the Edea-Kribi highway, the chief town of Ocean Division is in an even better position to live up to its reputation as a tourist heaven. Kribi is now only two hundred kilometres from Douala.

A touch of the sea graces every aspect of life in Kribi: the cosiest residences and the best hotels are situated along the Atlantic Ocean, in the shade of coconut trees.

The setting is ideal for relaxation and recreation, what with the Londji beaches, the Lobe falls, the nearby pigmy villages. It is such that any time spent in the region, even for work, can easily become a tourist excursion.

Kribi so attractive that one tends to forget that the South Province abounds with other tourist attractions. These include:

Ebolowa: A hilly and enchanting town built by the German, it is here that Martin Paul Samba, on of the heroes of the resistance movement against the Germans, was buried in 1914

- Akoafim: another German colonial town, 32 kilometres from Djourn along the road to Oveng Akoafim was abandoned in preference to Djourn
- Sangmelima, reputed for its cleanliness
- Lolodorf: founded by the German. The current residence of the divisional officer, a strategic relic with a German touch, is located at a vantage point where, like all other settlements founded by the German. It overlooks the rest of Lolodorf. It is the best spot from which to observe the town and the outlying areas:

The indelible marks missionaries such as:

- Elat, near Ebolowa, where the alliance between the natives and the white man was consecrated;
- The old Teacher Training College at Foulassi near Sangmelima where the national anthem "O Cameroon thou cradle of our Fathers" was composed;
- The Bible School at Bibia, close to Lolodorf, which has trained many generations of pastors;
- The Akoakas rock located 40 kilometres from Ebolowa on the road to metres from Ebolowa on the road to Ambam via Mekomo;
- The Mezesse rock near Sangmelima on the road to Mvomeka'a
- The Ntem falls at Memv'ele not far from Ambam;
- The two German tombs at Mefoup ("fields" in Bulu) about thirty kilometres from Ebolowa on the Ebolowa
- Ambam road, vestiges of the deadly battles between the
 German and the French on Cameroonian soil during World War I:
- The natural tunnel "Mbil Bekon" (hole of ghosts) at Nkoétype some ten kilometres from Ebolowa. Sightseers are advised not to go too deep inside this tunnel.







- The easiest and only way to get information on Kribi is through www. cameroon-tourism.webs.com, as it only takes 3 steps from Google.
- This tourism board website is also unreliable as it opens sometimes and at other times an invalid URL message is received.
- The Ministry of Tourism Cameroon site seems to not function properly as it is not possible to open the link.
- The Cameroon Association for Responsible Tourism (CAMAST) also does not provide any information on Kribi and is not comprehensive.
- It is important to note that none of the pages found offer very much detailed information on Kribi, and that many of the government and private websites do not function reliably making them almost useless.
- There needs to be at least one reliable website sponsored by the government or a private agency that can be easily accessed and can provide tourists at least some basic information on Cameroon and Kribi.





Kribi Power Development Company (KPDC) is in the process of building a natural gas-powered electricity generating plant, Kribi Power Station, in the community of Moolongwe, approximately

10 kilometres (6.2 mi), north of the Kribi central business district. The 216 MW plant that cost US\$390 million (CFA:176.3 billion) to build, is expected to come on line in the first half of 2013.[4]

Port

The vicinity of Kribi is a possible location of a port for the export of iron ore from about 500 kilometres (310 mi) away. Specifically, the port could be at Grand Batanga about halfway between Kribi and the border with Equatorial Guinea, which is 80 kilometres (50 mi), by road, to the south of Kribi. Since there is no natural harbour at Kribi, the port itself would be several kilometres offshore where deepwater of at least 20 metres (66 ft) is suitable for large Canasize ships. Tempted to rate this as excellent when compared to the competing hotels. If you know anything about Cameroon, its that this is not a country developed for tourists. Limbe is a more convenient resort area to Douala and Yaounde, but if you do go further afield and want to explore the countryside, then Kribi isnt a bad choice - if you stay in the right place. Initially we were booked into Royal Palm Hotel - it didnt look good. A short 10 minutes drive onward, and we were down a dirt track suddenly arriving at an idylic beach, with central beachfront lodge (think wooden beams, shaded loungers, calm waters and chilled out tunes playing) and to the rear a secure wing of small cabins (simple set up, but spot less and clean, mosquito nets, white clean bedding etc). Just remember to bring your own luxury toiletries - as with most other hotels in Cameroon if thats important to you - or your travelling partner. All in all - I left there much more relaxed than on arrival. I would recommend it for a quieter weekend. At the end of the beach you have a lagoon and famous waterfalls coming into the sea, apparently you can do a river trip up the rivers and see wild monkeys, animals and illusive pigmies. Or you can just stay at the beach.

However, Douala is a very different story. It gets very humid and hot - a nice recipe for insects especially mosquitoes causing malaria. Generally people use nets and good quality hotels spray their facilities daily and you shouldn't have any problem if you select a good one.






Overview of Tourist Reviews of Kribi from Tripadvisor

- There is much less material, discussion and reviews on Tripadvisor for Kribi, Cameroon when compared to Watamu, Kenya.
- Some of the positive attributes and pull factors for tourists to visit Kribi are the magnificent beaches, friendly hotel staff and people and the relaxing atmosphere.
- There are a number of concerns also voiced by tourists, including the lack of infrastructure for the purposes of tourism and complex travel to and from the destination via roads.
- Another concern is the presence of insects, especially those carrying malaria.
- An important theme for Kribi was the notion of "Value for the Money", as tourists
 often compared the cost of their trip with what type of experience the destinations will
 provide.
- Also most tourists compared the destination in the context of West African standards, thus accepting the shortcomings of the destination.
- Since Kribi is not developed to its full potential, prices are still not overly inflated, thus
 making it attractive for tourists who desire something different, but who are on a
 budget.
- There is an opportunity to develop Kribi to be a destination much like Watamu;
 whereby tourists can spend a few days at the beach and a few days on an inland safari or tour of national parks.




